# **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### **Engagement Committee - Joe Rottman**

- The committee continues to reach out to a handful of businesses every few weeks
- Response/interest from businesses has slowed from the previous quarter, perhaps as the committee contacts more established businesses vs. newer ones
- The committee is planning to discuss whether a shift in engagement strategy is warranted; perhaps more ad hoc, in-person visits vs. contact via email

### Governance Committee - Dillon Walker

- We skipped our November meeting due to travel and nonavailability
- Currently working on a draft revision to codify some core changes that we've discussed related to the Strategic Plan
- We need to review as a committee and then present for feedback to the Executive Committee
- On Hold: Welcome social event after board training
- Donovan & Dillon need to schedule monthly time with Whitney for Governance-Staff related work

#### Social Justice Committee - Randi Dorman

SJC collaborated with a team at the University of Arizona to conduct our first Downtown Community Perceptions Survey. The goal is to provide a baseline of attitudes and actions that we can monitor over time to ensure our social justice work is truly having impact.

#### Safety Summit - Tom Heath

- Lt Morales from TPD updated us on recent situations involving shootings and a stabbing. No outstanding suspects. Food truck driver who shot aggressor will most likely not be charged as it appears to be self defense situation and stabbing was between an uncle and nephew. No critical injuries in any of the cases.
- TPD would like input on food trucks at bar closing. Possibly not best practice as this creates large clusters of intoxicated people, creates environment for incidents to occur. Would getting people out of downtown/4<sup>th</sup> quickly at that time work out better for safety?

- TPD had increased resources Halloween weekend and that proved beneficial in reducing incidents. Planning has begun for night before Thanksgiving and input was given on needs for NYE. This year is on a Saturday and forecasted weather is pleasant.
- Mr. McGill discussed narcan pilot program Hotel Congress is collaborating with TPD on starting. Interest shown from group on more information and follow up.
- Conversation on prevalence of weapons nightlife customers bring downtown/4<sup>th</sup> and benefits of screening customers at point of entry.
- DTP updated on overall happenings downtown and homeless population is decreasing. Effort made by DTP and TPD to clean up store fronts and increase patrols is showing to be very effective.
- Crystal gave update from residential perspective with a presentation.
   Most concerns from residents are in regards to unnecessary street noise (drag racing, after market mufflers, cruising), also needs for possible changes in signage/landscaping for safer traffic flow.
- Salvation Army is accepting warm clothing/blankets at hospitality house located at 1002 N. Main Ave
- The Arizona Bowl is sponsoring a New Year's Eve bash again at 5th and Toole, from 6pm to 1am. The event was a little quieter last year than previous because the bowl game had just been canceled
- Next meeting time and upcoming events closed out the meeting.
