Dominic reported that Las Jefas is attributing this slow sign-up rate generally to the space being new and relatively unknown, which has resulted in vendor hesitancy to commit when compared to other venues and locations.	5.c. 	Las Jefas reported that the November 25, 2023, and December 23, 2023, dates will likely be cancelled due to the market dates being so close to the holidays from a customer-traffic perspective. Consequently, Las Jefas Market and EVA staff recommend postponing the launch of the EV Artisan Market until the new year, launching in January 2024 instead. Chad Johnson agreed with the recommendation and stated that	

	momentum and continuity is key for the Market to be a success.	
d. East Village Oktoberfest Partnership with It'sFarOut – Update	5.d. Dominic reported that Justin Navalle of Its Far-Out is partnering with EVA to produce the 7th Annual East Village Oktoberfest at 13 th and Market Street. Dominic stated that the event will be a unique take on Oktoberfest and will integrate German and Mexican heritage.	5.d. No action taken

Dominic shared that Cash-for-Trash works with the unhoused community via a trash collection system by offering a \$2.00 stipend for every bag of trash collected and returned. This system is offered twice a week with a dumpster located off 16th and Commercial Street from 8:00am-12:00pm. Dominic stated that Lucky Duck is interested in expanding the program with additional sites and outreach workers. Dominic summarized that while this would be a good PR narrative for the East Village, we cannot directly mitigate maintenance concerns potentially created by this partnership. Dominic suggested that the site remain at the 16th and Commercial Street location however the EVA look into increasing the days of operation.	5.b. No action taken
