



JULY 2016

MLB All- Star Game The 2016 Major League Baseball All-Star Game and Events weekend was the 87th edition of the Major League Baseball All-Star Game. The July 12, 2016 game was hosted by the San Diego Padres and played in East Village's Petco Park.

COMIC-CON Comic-Con International: San Diego, began in 1970 when a group of comics, movie, and science fiction fans — including the late Shel Dort, Ken Kruger, and Richard Alf — collectively put on the first comic book convention in Southern California. This global even is hosted annual by the downtown community, including the East Village.

Fringe Festival EVA helped support and promote the San Diego Fringe Festival.
