Dear Director Velasquez,

Downtown San Diego, and especially our Little Italy neighborhood, has seen the tragic impact of unhoused citizens living without shelter for many years now. As a neighborhood that has been consistently impacted by people lacking shelter and living on the street, we are writing you to strongly support the San Diego Housing Commission's (SDHC) applications to the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) Round 3 Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for Homekey Program grant funding.

We all know that the construction of new housing units, and hundreds more,, is the solution to this emergency situation in the state, and that Project Homekey, managed by the San Diego Housing Commission, is the best long term resolution to people living on our streets and sidewalks. With previous HCD awards of Homekey funds, the City of San Diego (City), County of San Diego (County) and SDHC have collaborated to create more than 350 permanent affordable rental housing units with supportive services, also known as permanent supportive housing, for people experiencing homelessness in the City.

SDHC's applications to the Round 3 NOFA has the potential to create more than 300 additional permanent supportive housing units needed to address the homelessness crisis. These units will provide opportunities to secure affordable rental homes of their own with access to the services they need, increasing the likelihood of achieving housing stability. The need for additional housing to address homelessness in San Diego remains significant. The annual Point-in-Time Count conducted by the San Diego Regional Task Force on Homelessness (RTFH) on January 26, 2023, identified 6,500 individuals experiencing homelessness in the City of San Diego, a 35% increase from 2022. Throughout San Diego County in July 2023, the number of people experiencing homelessness for the first time continued to outpace the number of individuals who obtained housing during the month, a trend repeated in every month since September 2022, according to RTFH reports.

We urge you to award Homekey funds to SDHC to achieve new housing opportunities for these citizens in critical need of housing.



# PIAZZA COSTANZA

\$150,000

Margaret "Midge" Costanza was a social and political activist who served as a top advisor to President Jimmy Carter. Known for her wit, outspoken manner and commitment to her convictions, she fought for the rights and dignity of all people, particularly women, the LGBTQ community, and other marginalized groups. The daughter of Sicilian immigrants Midge Costanza became the first City councilwoman in Rochester, New York in 1973. She later rose to become the first female Assistant to a U.S. President. Midge moved to San Diego in the 1980s where she was active in numerous organizations and issues. She had the rare ability to bring together people with different viewpoints to accomplish a shared civic goal. In honor of her outstanding service, the Little Italy Association would like to create a new Piazza Costanza which would include a monument with a bronze bust sculpture of Midge, custom planters with quotes from Midge with enhanced landscaping, hanging flower baskets, and tables and chairs with umbrellas.
