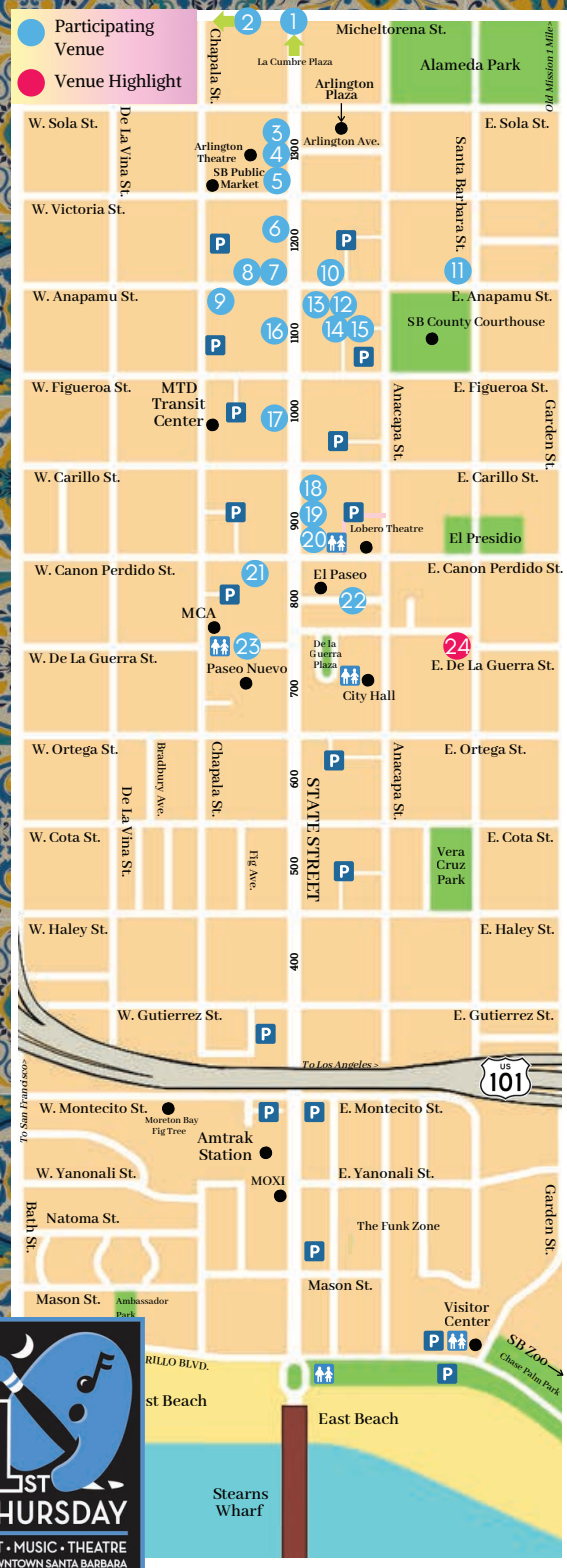

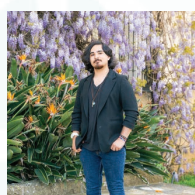
18. SuperMoss 922 State Street

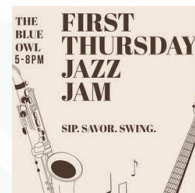

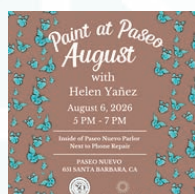
22. Soul Sucker 814 State Street STE 38

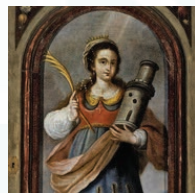
23. Paint at Paseo The Parlor, 651 Paseo Nuevo

18 W. Micheltorena St., Unit D

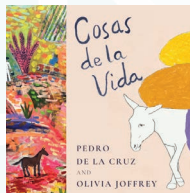

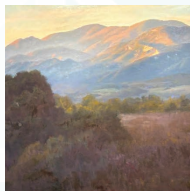

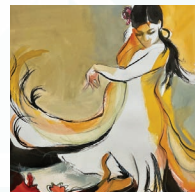
