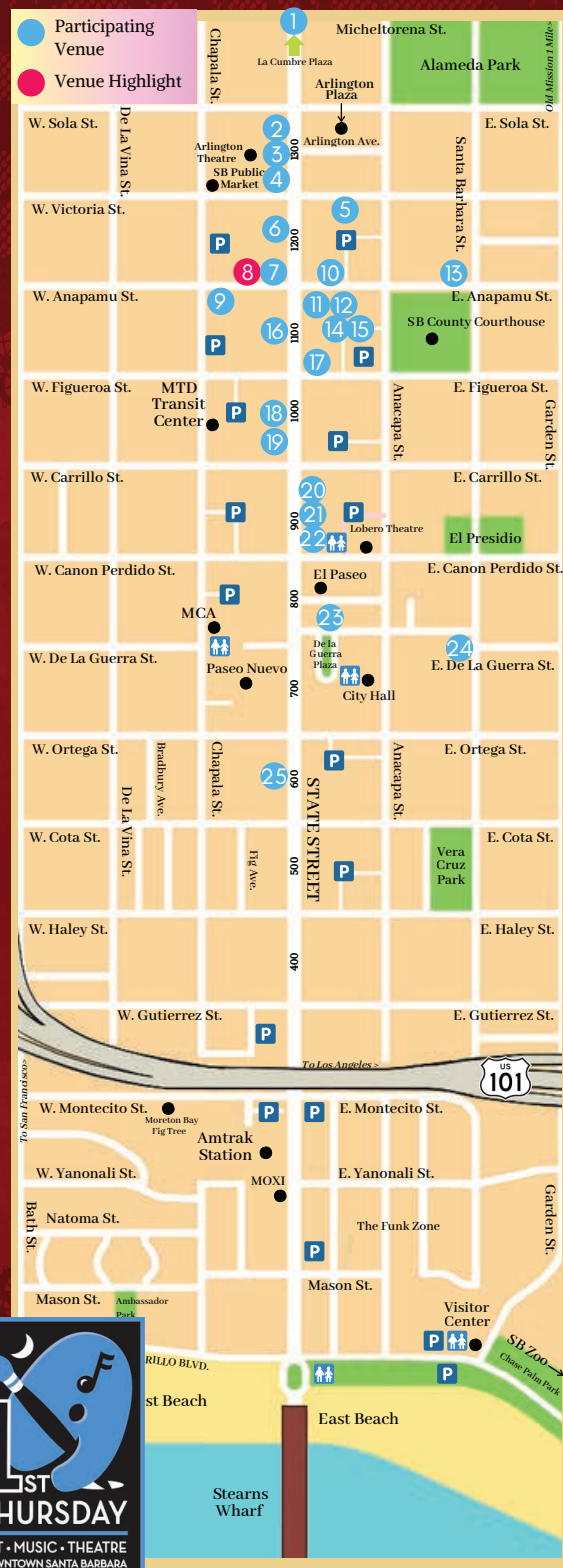


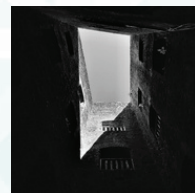

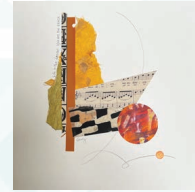

1323 State Street

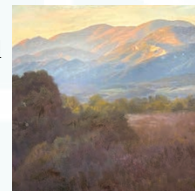

1223 State Street

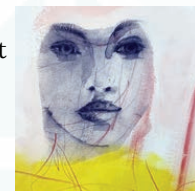

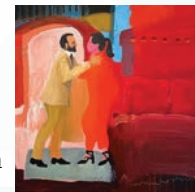

12 W. Anapamu St.

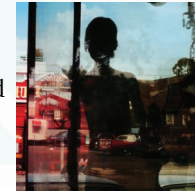

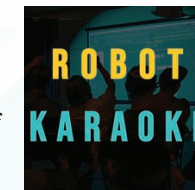

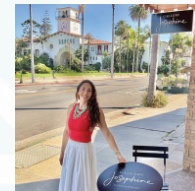


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13. Gallery Josephine

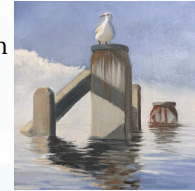
