RE: Noise Variance Request from Insituform Technologies, LLC. for nighttime construction activity associated with the Blake Street Sanitary Sewer Pipe Lining Project.

Dear Residents and Neighborhood Organizations,

This notification is being sent to inform you that the Denver Department of Public Health and Environment (DDPHE) has received an application for a noise variance from Insituform Technologies, LLC for nighttime construction work. This construction work will consist of accessing sanitary sewer lines through manholes for the purpose of installing cured-in-place-pipe liner into existing sewer lines that are at risk of collapse if not repaired. This project will take place on Blake St. from the intersection of Blake St. and 31st St. to Blake St. and 35th St. located within the City County of Denver.

Noise variances are necessary when nighttime construction work is being proposed and noise levels above existing conditions are expected. Night work is scheduled to begin as early as November 2022 with approximately 14 nights of construction needed for the project to be completed by December 15, 2022.

The noisiest operations are expected to be the installation and curing phases of the project. More specifically the equipment expected to produce significant noise are boiler trucks, bypass pumps, air compressors, light plants, and forklifts.

DDPHE is working with the applicant to address noise concerns. The Board of Public Health and Environmental (BPHE) will convene at an upcoming meeting to discuss and then approve/deny this variance request.
