DENVER — On Friday, August 7, [RiNo Art District](#) (RAD) opens its Creative District Welcome Center and launches a new community gallery space at the [RiNo ArtPark](#) with an inaugural exhibition, *Welcome Back*.

[Jill Hadley Hooper](#), co-founder of RiNo Art District, and [Jonas Sanchez](#), a Denver-based emerging curator, were invited to co-curate *Welcome Back*, with nearly 60 artists exhibiting works in diverse media. The exhibition will be on view in the Truss House gallery through September 12, and the Welcome Center gallery through October 24. The exhibition intentionally bridges artists who from the founding era of the certified Creative District with a younger generation carrying forward the district's renowned DIY spirit, creating a living conversation between generations.
