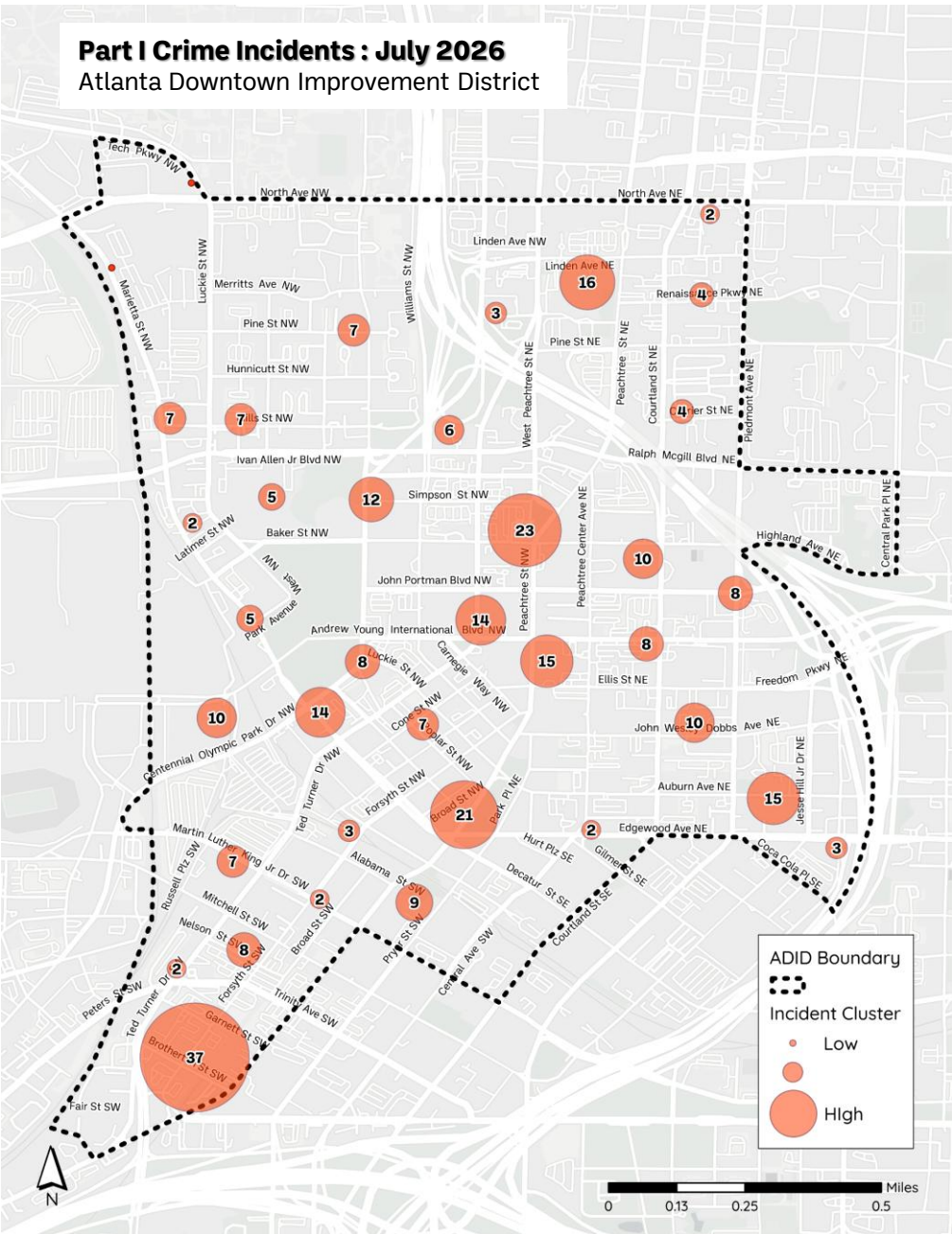

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PART I CRIME: JULY 2026 SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Atlanta Downtown Improvement District

Slight Rise in Crime Incidents

In July 2026, the Atlanta Downtown Improvement District saw a 3% rise in crime incidents compared to the previous month. Crime incidents remain 40% lower than in July 2025. Monthly visits to Downtown dropped, totaling about 4.6 million visits, and led to a 10% month-over-month increase in the crime rate. This equates to almost 2 crimes per 100,000 visits to Downtown, indicating a low likelihood of experiencing a crime during a visit.

Increase in Thefts from Motor Vehicles

The number of thefts from motor vehicles increased by 26%, with 29 break-ins reported. While the hot spot analysis shows a decline in repeat locations, two new hot spots appeared: 21 Ellis St NE and around 375 Luckie St NW. Notably, break-ins at Peachtree Center Parking Lots were 100% below previous levels following security upgrades, with no incidents reported in July.

Violent Crime Incidents

A total of 25 violent crimes were reported, driven primarily by aggravated assaults and robberies. While these incidents occurred across various areas of Downtown, 37% of aggravated assaults occurred on public property.

Persistent Panhandling Challenges

Panhandling interventions increased slightly by only 2%, with over 1,810 engagements recorded. Persistent activity continues in key areas, including 309 Edgewood Ave NE (Atlanta Fire Rescue Station 4), the Peachtree St/Peachtree Center commercial corridor, 110 Marietta St NW (Glenn Hotel), Ivan Allen Jr Blvd NW & Luckie St NW, 160 Ted Turner Dr NW (The American Hotel), 135 Andrew Young International Blvd NE (Waffle House), and 595 Piedmont Ave NE (Walgreens).

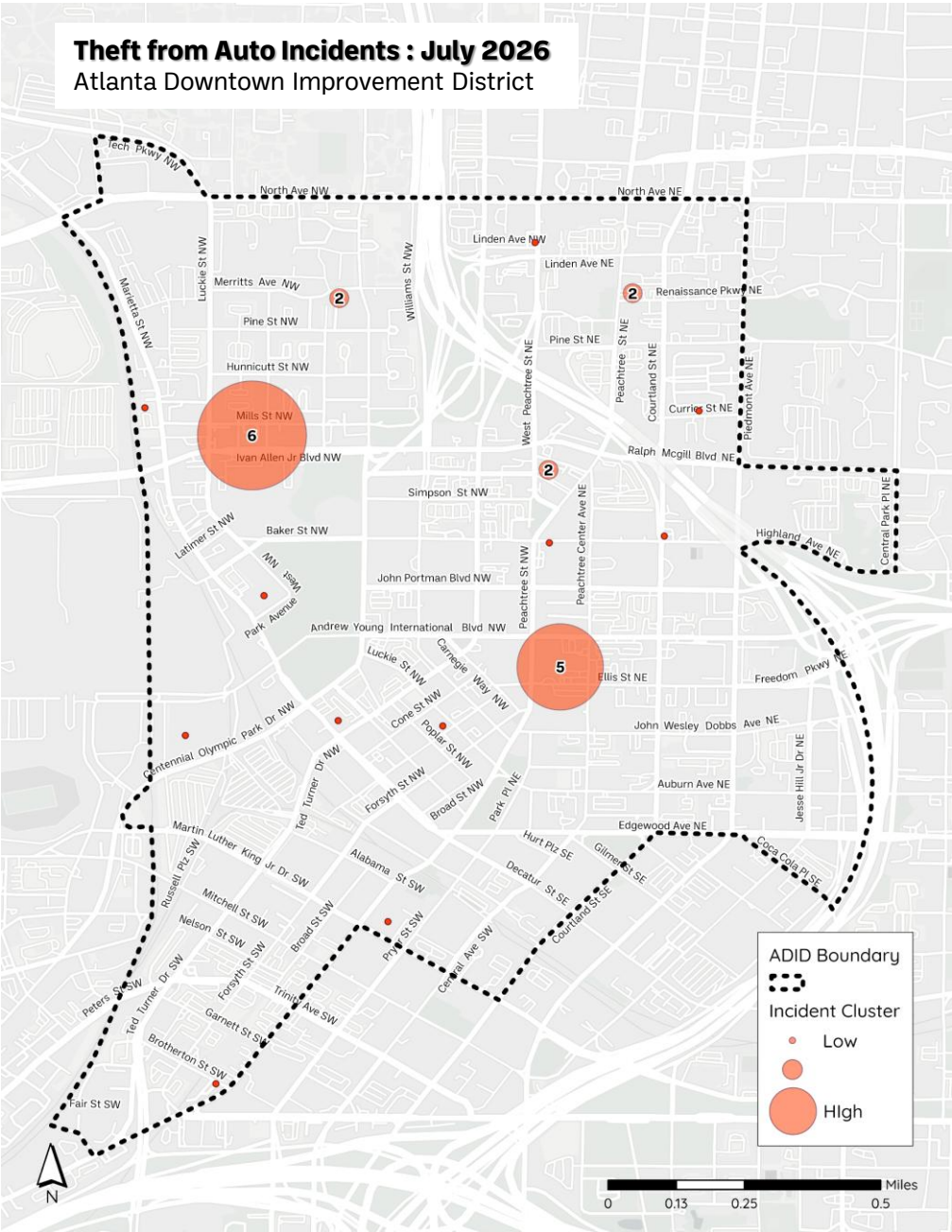
