## PILOT PROJECT: Pedestrian Scramble 10th Street @ Piedmont Avenue

August 10, 2022

### Project Description

On Monday, August 15, 2022, Atlanta Department of Transportation (ATL DOT) crews will install a pedestrian scramble (diagonal crossing) at the intersection of 10th Street NE and Piedmont Avenue NE, and make changes to the allowed movements from the travel lanes on 10th Street NE. This pilot will investigate possible intersection safety improvements associated with the Central Midtown Connection Plan and is scheduled to end on Monday, August 29, 2022. During the pilot, ATL DOT will assess traffic flow and gather additional data to develop strategies for making the intersection safer for all users.

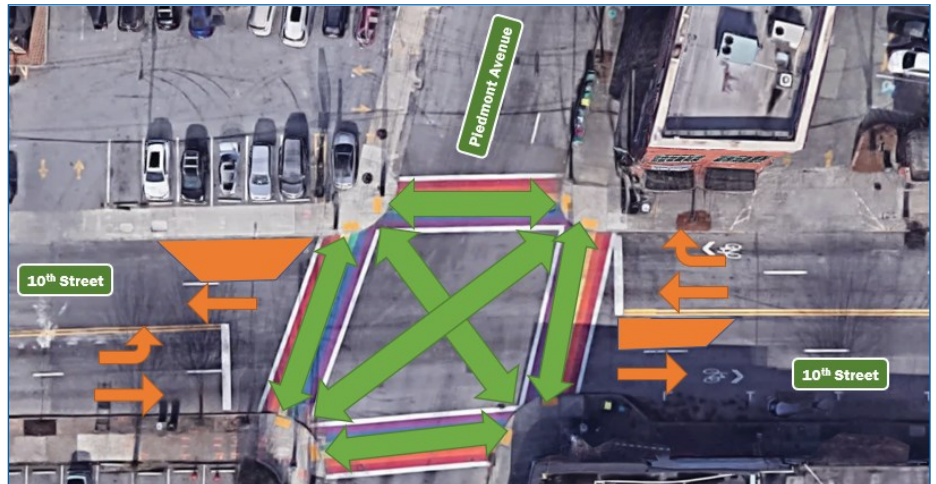
### Location

Intersection of 10th Street NE and Piedmont Avenue NE

### Schedule

- ⇒ The pilot is expected to be in place from Monday, August 15- Monday, August 29, 2022.
- ⇒ Pilot set-up will begin on Sunday, August 14, 2022.

### Other Details



- ⇒ ATL DOT and Midtown Alliance staff are gathering data from intersection cameras, as well as feedback from residents, commuters, and community and business stakeholders.
- ⇒ Pedestrians will be allowed to cross the intersection diagonally (as indicated by green arrows on image above).
- ⇒ Drivers heading east on 10th Street NE will not be allowed to go straight from the leftmost lane; that lane will temporarily be left-turn only onto Piedmont Avenue NE. Drivers heading west on 10th Street NE will not be allowed to go straight from the rightmost lane; that lane will temporarily be right-turn only onto Piedmont Avenue NE. (as indicated by orange arrows on image above).
- ⇒ Signage, temporary striping, and barricades indicating the new traffic pattern on 10th Street NE eastbound and westbound will be installed on Sunday, August 14. The pedestrian scramble phase will be activated on Monday, August 15.
- ⇒ We urge pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists to maintain environmental awareness during this pilot.
