# What is Atlanta Streets Alive?

Atlanta Streets Alive opens streets temporarily for constituents to bike, walk, skate, dance, and play. It is FREE to the public; the event turns the street into a park space that connects our city. Atlanta Streets Alive is not a festival, parade or a race, attendees can start or stop at any point.

They have been proven to be a great economic generator for local businesses and they transform our streets, even just for a day, into people spaces. These events were formerly managed by Propel ATL but are now managed by ATLDOT.







## Goal nº 01

Streamline and secure open street permitting to run Peachtree Street between Mitchell Street to 14th Street, connecting Midtown and Downtown for pedestrians and bikers alike.



### Goal nº 02

Promote safe transportation options on our city streets + promote healthy physical activity.



### Goal nº 03

Support local business sales and support growing audiences for new developments along the route.

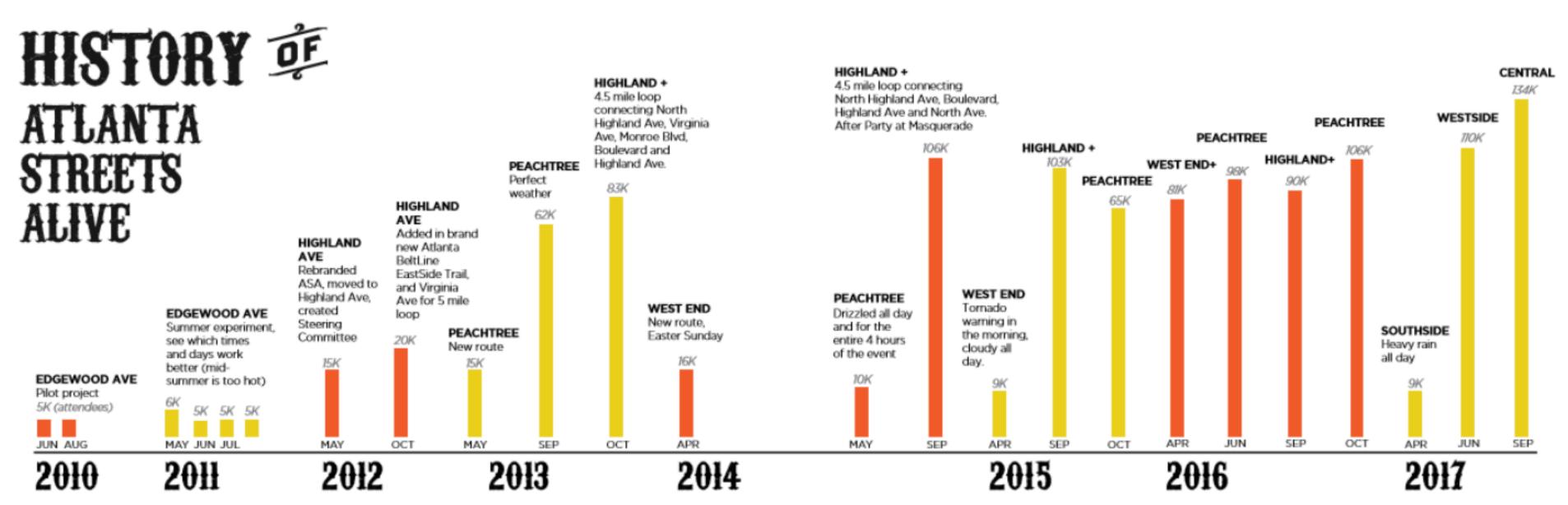


### Goal nº 04

Support ATLDOT's *Moving Atlanta Forward* initiative pillars "One Safe City" "A City of Opportunity for All" "A City Built for the Future" and "Effective and Ethical Government.

Atlanta Streets Alive was formally run by the *Atlanta Bike Coalition*, now *Propel ATL*, for 10 years, producing 29 open streets programs with estimated 1.5 million total attendees.

Atlanta Streets Alive steadily increased attendance to an est 134k in 2017 along Peachtree St.



In 2020, legislation was drafted to establish ASA as a monthly recurring program by the City of Atlanta. In 2023, ATLDOT hired staff to make this a reality.

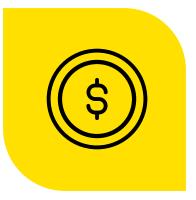

# DO

Host a 10'x10' info table for your organization at a pop-up tent offering giveaways or a community activity; must provide your own tent.

# DO

Get creative... a children's clothing store could offer fun and FREE relay races for kids or a hula-hoop contest. A brewpub could host field-day type games for adults.

# **DON'T**

No alcohol sales in the public right of way. Regular liquor license requirements apply.

# DO

If you're along the route invite those on foot to stop in. All vending must take place inside your place of business.
