

Midtown Public Safety Summary


SPRING 2022

In a district that attracts more than 50K people each day, there have been only 10 violent crimes in 2022 that didn't involve people that knew each other or fights that escalated.

58% of violent crime incidents happened between 11pm and 5am.

One-third of the way through the year, crime in the Midtown Improvement District is down compared to the same period in 2021.


Violent Crime is Down Year-Over-Year
(18 weeks, Jan 1-May 7 '21 vs '22)



Your chances of being the victim of a violent crime in Midtown remain extremely low.

- 60% of stranger-on-stranger incidents of violent crime in 2022 involved people who are not Midtown residents.

Property Crime is Down Year-Over-Year
(18 weeks, Jan 1-May 7 '21 vs '22)



78% of the total incidents of crime in Midtown in '22 YTD involved car break-ins or stolen vehicles.

- Many of these crimes are preventable with valuables left in plain sight or keys in vehicles.
- Two-thirds of cars stolen in Midtown this year were illegally parked and running, or with their key fobs in them.


91% of total incidents of crime in Midtown YTD are non-violent property crimes.

Property crimes involving cars (break-ins and stolen autos) are the overwhelming majority of these incidents.

Note: There have been no commercial or residential robberies reported in the district year-to-date.

Public Safety Spotlight: MARTA

We pick a topic to highlight for each of our summaries. In this report, we cover rider safety on the MARTA system.

In Midtown:

Year-to-date, there have been only five incidents of crime that occurred at MARTA stations in Midtown.

- One incident involved a rider's smartphone being stolen.
- Two incidents included stolen property (e-scooter stolen from bike rack, bicycle tire stolen).
- One incident was an aggravated assault between two people who had an encounter that escalated.
- One incident involved a person suffering a mental health crisis who produced a weapon and was taken into custody by MARTA PD.

There have been an estimated 1,000,000 MARTA rider trips originating or ending in Midtown so far this year.

System-Wide:

MARTA is one of the largest public transit agencies in the US.

Ridership on both bus or rail rebounded to almost 42M trips in 2021 and crime was down 17%.

There were 170 reported crimes* systemwide affecting MARTA riders in 2021 (=4 incidents per one million rider trips).

**Note: MARTA Police data include crimes committed against MARTA's operations (such as theft of MARTA property, arson on MARTA property, etc).*

The figure cited above only counts those incidents involving riders.

Other Facts:

The MARTA Police Department has more than 300 police officers and protective specialists that patrol rail stations and ride buses and trains in uniform, in addition to 40K video surveillance cameras systemwide.

MARTA's partnership with HOPE Atlanta aids individuals experiencing homelessness to place them into supportive services.
