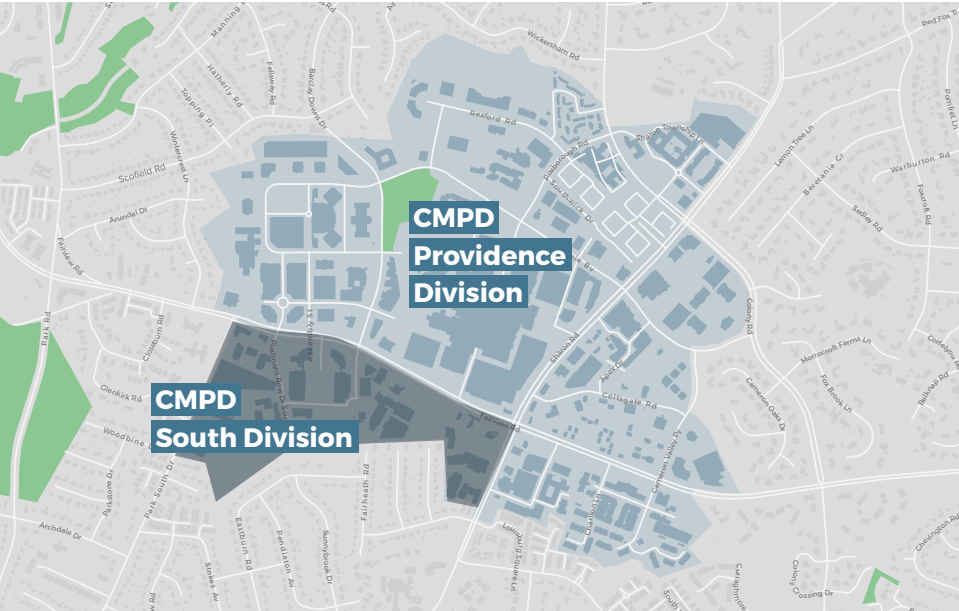


SouthPark Public Safety Resources

CMPD Patrol Divisions in SouthPark

The SouthPark area is split between two CMPD patrol divisions, making it even more important to share information across property lines and geographic boundaries.

Part of the SouthPark Municipal Service District, outlined in blue on the adjacent map, falls within CMPD's Providence Division. The remainder of the district, shown in gray, is within the South Division.

Prevent crimes of opportunity

A majority of car break-ins that occurred in SouthPark last year involved cars that were unlocked. Secure your valuables and firearms, and lock your doors every time.
