### Akron's Mayflower Manor Emerges from \$25M Renovation

The city's Mayflower Manor, a famous hotel in the 1930s that in more recent decades has been a site of subsidized housing for seniors and others, has re-emerged from a nearly five-year renovation process that its owners say has transformed and renewed it.

"We've finished," said Sam Horowitz, a principal of New York's Capital Realty Group that owns the building and renovated it during the pandemic and its associated labor and material shortages.

"The project was pretty difficult because of the pandemic," Horowitz said. "But the quality of the work came out beautifully, and we were able to restore a nearly 100-year-old building." Dan Shingler, Crain's Cleveland Business, Apr. 6, 2023

In its third iteration, the Downtown Akron Sakura Festival—referred to in years past, more modestly, as a celebration—was successful beyond all hope and expectation. Amid boarded windows, blockades ready to be moved into roadways, and palpable tension in the community, people still came downtown from far and wide to take a breath, spend time with loved ones, and experience the beauty of the cherry blossom trees that were just past peak bloom.

Last year, at the 2022 celebration, we estimated there were roughly 1,000 people in attendance. This year, anticipating humble growth, we planned for 1,500. In reality, we saw closer to 6,000. Such a volume of visitors, combined with the 2,000 luminarias lining the Towpath Trail on a larger footprint than ever before, made for an event that was spectacular by every count.

Every hub of activity was delightfully packed for the duration of the event, which was heartwarming to say the least. It also supported the assertion we make every day, which is that downtown Akron is vibrant and valuable to our city and region; a place to come together and experience joy in community; and a place to exist in good company, experience culture, and perhaps even learn something new.





Akron's Bounce Innovation Hub wrapped up its first five years of existence in January and has announced its annual results and its total impact in key areas since it opened at the start of 2018.

We believe that Akron's future is full of potential and possibility and that the residents of this community already possess the tools and talents to build a better future together.



#### **AKRON METRO RTA**

Metro Regional Transit Authority transports millions of passengers annually to work, school, medical appointments, and "hot spots" in and around the city of Akron and Summit County. It has a long history of service to the community, from its founding in 1882 with a few mule-drawn carts to a fleet of roughly 200 passenger vehicles today, largely buses.

In the century-plus in between, METRO used street cars and provided transportation using Goodyear Tire and Rubber



Company's bus fleet, which should come as no surprise since Akron has been known as the "rubber capital of the world." In the 1970s, METRO became a forward-thinking leader in the regional transportation sector by providing service specifically for seniors and becoming the first transit group in the northern region of the U.S. to offer service designed to meet the needs of residents with disabilities, several years before the passing of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). METRO RTA AWARDED NEARLY \$38M FOR NEW MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS FACILITY

Two Northeast Ohio transit authorities have been awarded a combined \$42 million in federal funding, U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown (D-OH) and U.S. Representative Emilia Sykes (D-OH-13) announced on Friday [June 23].

The funding comes via a pair of Buses and Bus Facilities Grants from the U.S. Department of Transportation's (DOT) Federal Transit Administration (FTA). The grants are a part of the bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.



Dawn Distler, chief executive officer, Akron Metropolitan Regional Transit Authority said, "The Maintenance and Operations Facility will be a key component to ensuring we can further our mission and continue to offer fair and equitable transportation solutions to the community we serve 365 days a year. Our current facility was built in the '80s before we were a countywide system and had fewer than 100 buses. We now have over 230 buses, and as we continue to grow, this facility will enable us to serve the region for years to come. This funding represents a landmark investment in keeping our community thriving, and that is a legacy we can all be proud of." *Find Out More*.






