Applicant's Request:	South City Good Neighbor Grant up to \$50,000.
Project Description:	The subject property is located on the northern side of Vance Ave., in the block between Cynthia Pl. and S Orleans St. The site contains a 2,200 sq. ft. building, built in 1951. The ground floor is occupied by the owner, and the second floor is used as an apartment. There are two entrances along the Vance Ave. façade, one door that leads to the apartment on the second floor, and one into the ground floor commercial space. There is a third entrance at the rear of the building.

	City Neighborhood. The new outdoor seating space, exterior lighting, art, and planters create an inviting atmosphere for pedestrians. An increase in pedestrian activity, lighting, and ownership in the neighborhood increases perceived safety with business owners, pedestrians, and residents.
	The owner intends to hire qualified applicants from the neighborhood to occupy the ground floor retail space as a coffee shop. The ground floor will also sell and display local Memphis artwork. The second-floor apartment tenant will remain.
	Staff is supportive of approving a SCGN grant with such high visibility on a primary gateway into Downtown. This application is a prime example of the type of project the SCGN was designed to support, a local minority applicant transforming an idle building into an active space, that hires local workers and sells local art.
Staff Recommendation:	Staff recommends approval of a South City Good Neighbor Grant in an amount up to <u>\$50,000</u> based on approved receipts and subject to all standard closing requirements.
