Good Neighbor Grant

The Good Neighbor Grant (2022) mirrors the South City Good Neighbor Grant program, with adjustments to reflect current priorities and funding availability. The purpose of the grant is to help neighborhoods fight blight and to provide commercial property owners and businesses the resources to make exterior improvements to their property. After board discussion, Elizabeth Low motioned to approve the request as presented, Demar Roberts seconded the motion, after roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously.
