DOWNTOWN NASHVILLE: 2023

In a year when headlines were filled with cliched themes such as the urban doom loop, emptying urban offices and questioning the future of cities, downtown Nashville stands out again. Nashville ranks #1 in the country in recovery post-pandemic, recapturing 100% of residents, workers and visitors combined, per a study by Center City District in Philadelphia and International Downtown Association. And Nashville earned the first-ever three-peat of #1 Market to Watch in the ULI/PwC Emerging Trends in Real Estate 2024 report.

Some might say downtown Nashville is America's darling, and in many ways we are. The Nashville Downtown Partnership knows that steadfastness and focus are necessary to earn and maintain these lofty rankings and ratings. This has been the core purpose of our organization for 29 years, and we've never been busier as we work to build an even better downtown for more people to love. We are able to do this work thanks to our partners: the many businesses and property owners who invest in themselves and a clean, safe, active and attractive neighborhood.

2023 ended with so much opportunity ahead: As a city, we welcomed Mayor O'Connell as the 10th mayor of Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County, as well as a new Metro Council; we worked on a downtown traffic study that will chart the course for improved mobility; and we voted to build a new domed stadium on the East Bank that will redefine our downtown as we know it. The Nashville Downtown Partnership stands ready to work to ensure our downtown neighborhood is good for all of us.

On behalf of the entire Nashville Downtown Partnership staff, I want to thank our board chair, William Hastings, as well as the entire board of directors for their leadership. To our partners and all who live, work, play and invest in downtown Nashville: Thank you for making a difference in your downtown and helping us build a center city that is the pride of many, and the envy of many more.




LIVE DOWNTOWN

Downtown's residential offerings are multiplying, and residential neighborhoods are beginning to take shape, each with unique offerings. Downtown living remains in high demand, keeping pace with the steady delivery of new product to market.

Residential Growth

Over **5,000** residential units delivered in downtown Nashville in the past five years, with occupancy rates maintaining at 90% or above.



WHO LIVES DOWNTOWN?

Baby boomers make up the largest cohort downtown (35%), followed by Generation Z (31%) and Generation Y (27%). Seventy-eight percent of residents have a household income in excess of \$80,000, and 28% have an annual household income that exceeds \$200,000.

CONNECT DOWNTOWN STUDY


Nashville Downtown Partnership collaborated on the Connect Downtown traffic study, a project with the Nashville Department of Transportation (NDOT), WeGo Public Transit and the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT). The study began in 2022, and a draft action plan was released in late 2023 with five "Big Move" recommendations to:

- 1. Manage congestion
- 2. Improve safety
- 3. Move more people
- 4. Create complete networks
- 5. Maximize the curb

The Downtown Partnership will remain a partner as the draft goes through refinement from recommendations to implementation.
