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## **DOWNTOWN NASHVILLE: 2021**

Less than one week before the start of this year, our downtown's most historic corridor was the scene of a tragic explosion. The Christmas Day bomb didn't just impact 400 residents and more than 50 businesses near Second Avenue North, but a downtown neighborhood and the Greater Nashville region. This has been a long and difficult year as our community continues revisioning, restoring and rebuilding a beloved piece of downtown's history, all while navigating the ongoing challenges of a global pandemic.

The solidarity our community expressed in 2020 – despite our social distancing and closures – continues into 2021. Today our downtown neighborhood stands just as #NashvilleStrong as any Nashville neighborhood, as evidenced in part by many facts and key figures you will read in this report. And while it is true that downtown is thriving in many ways – we saw a record number of building permits and retail openings this year as examples – we continue to address the challenges of a growing city. Together with our public and private partners, we are working to make downtown a clean, safe, welcoming city for all, and are doing so with new resources and initiatives.

On behalf of the entire Nashville Downtown Partnership staff, I want to thank the board of directors for their keen leadership in such uncertain times. Under thoughtful governance, the Partnership was given flexibility to best meet the needs of our residents, businesses, employees and stakeholders. I'm proud of the work our staff carried out, balancing multiple crises while addressing challenges and meeting opportunities. I am also proud of our elected officials, the many dedicated Metro employees and first responders for all they do throughout the year.

For the past 10 years, the Outreach program has provided direct housing relief to downtown's most vulnerable populations. In Q4 of 2020, the Partnership was one of nine agencies to receive an Emergency Solutions Grant made possible by the CARES Act (ESG-CV) to address the needs of the region's unsheltered population. This investment allowed the partnership to grow from one to three Outreach FTEs.

This injection of funding provided housing for 37 clients this year compared to an annual average of 12. Our community also benefits from increased communication and a shared database across the nine agencies tackling this important work.

#### SPOTLIGHT: INCREASED RESOURCES = A BETTER DOWNTOWN

As of July 2021, an additional quarter-cent (\$0.0025) sales tax is assessed on qualifying transactions within the CBID. The additional quarter-cent fee leveraged at cash registers throughout the district is known collectively as the Business Development Fund. It will be managed by the Partnership and spent exclusively on additional clean and safe services, including:

Special event trash pickup

MNPD officers and NDP ambassadors conducting daily quality-of-life patrols

Daily pressure-washing crews



# LIVE DOWNTOWN

Downtown Nashville continues to grow as a desirable neighborhood to live in, as evidenced by both the continued construction of apartment and condo options, and the low vacancy rates. Residential population in downtown has grown 152% in the last decade (2011–2021), and the growth continues. As of late 2021, there are 4,125 residential units under construction and 6,082 in the planning pipeline.



# **PLAY DOWNTOWN**

Downtown Nashville continues to host the best in sporting, cultural and entertainment events.

**NISSAN STADIUM** hosted **43,000+** soccer fans for the U.S. Men's National Team World Cup qualifier match against Canada.

**FIFTH + BROADWAY** opened in February 2021, bringing **200,000** square feet of fun to downtown. In the short period of time since opening, more than **4.75 MILLION** visitors have experienced the mixed-use project!

The inaugural MUSIC CITY GRAND PRIX hosted 110,000 spectators throughout the downtown footprint over three days and garnered 1.2 MILLION viewers on NBCSN, making it the most-watched NTT IndyCar Series race in 23 years.

The new **NATIONAL MUSEUM OF AFRICAN AMERICAN MUSIC** was named one of 2021's best new museums by USA Today.

# **DOWNTOWN NOW**



#### What's NEW and What's NOW in Downtown Nashville

Despite the challenging year, 2021 brought about significant changes and improvements that will be seen and felt by all who experience this vibrant neighborhood for many years to come. Here's a glimpse of some of the most significant ways our downtown evolved to new heights.



#### REP. JOHN LEWIS WAY DEDICATION AND MARCH

In July 2021, Fifth Avenue was formally dedicated in memory of the late civil rights leader and congressman whose civil rights legacy started in Nashville, John Lewis. Downtown Nashville was the setting where thousands gathered for a dedication to recognize Lewis' passion for civil justice and contributions to our nation.



#### **FITDOWNTOWN**

In the summer of 2021, Nashville Downtown Partnership launched a placemaking pilot aimed at downtown residents and employees, encouraging creative and active use of the neighborhood through fitness practice. As a testament to both the NDP member organizations who hosted the events and the downtown community who attended, the summer series quickly developed a following on social media and reinforced demand for regularly scheduled activations. Expanded FitDowntown offerings are in the works for 2022.



#### CHURCH STREET PARK

Church Street Park was officially reopened to the downtown community on June 3 after a months-long renovation. The Historic Capitol Corridor Foundation (HCCF) and Biederman Redevelopment Ventures now provide the neighborhood a beautiful, serene space boasting regular activations and robust usage since its redesign. Just two months in operation, it was announced in August that programming had been extended into June of 2022 due to its overwhelmingly positive community response, and a generous grant from Amazon.

### SPOTLIGHT: TRAGEDY & REBIRTH

#### ON HISTORIC SECOND AVENUE





The Christmas Day explosion of 2020 continues to be felt in our downtown neighborhood at the end of 2021 and will be felt for many years to come. The tragic event occurred on the 241st anniversary of our city's founding in a historic corridor that was, in those early days, the center of Nashville's business and commerce, where Nashville's early business transactions were conducted, just off the Cumberland River.

Metro Nashville's public servants from the Police, Fire and Emergency Services departments reminded us all of the fundamental responsibilities of government: Our first responders saved lives and continue to serve the property owners, businesses and residents on the journey of revisioning, restoring and rebuilding.

As we now look ahead to restore, revitalize and reevaluate a historic Second Avenue that serves all of Nashville, we cannot help but realize the opportunity presented. The Partnership is proud to work alongside Mayor John Cooper, Metro Planning, GHP Environmental & Architecture, and hundreds of individual residents and private partners to build back better.





# **GETTING AROUND**

#### IN DOWNTOWN

As the densest part of Davidson County, downtown Nashville is the epicenter of our community's evolving conversations around transit demand management, parking and curbside management solutions. The Partnership has been a part of these solutions in several ways.

#### PARKIT! DOWNTOWN PARK-AND-RIDE SHUTTLES

Despite COVID-19's impact on the downtown workforce, the Partnership's ParkIt! Downtown Shuttles continued to operate and provide last-mile commuting solutions for 153 employers in 2021.

NashvilleDowntown.com is a reliable resource helping visitors, employees and residents understand parking options with an interactive map of 50 garages, 138 surface lots and 45,753 overall parking spaces.

In 2021, the Partnership committed to working with partners on the Downtown Neighborhood Traffic Project, part of Metro's Transportation Plan.
