PID #1 BUDGET

On July 27, the PID Board met to consider three budget options for the next fiscal year. The first option was based on the current 11.5 cents per \$100 of property value. Due to commercial property valuation decreases (reportedly covid-related), this option would necessitate a \$300,000 reduction in services. The second option was to raise the rate to 12.5 cents. This budget would have resulted in modest decreases in services. The third option raised the rate to 13 cents to maintain the current level of services and add additional planter bed maintenance and tree light re-installation.



The PID Board recommended option 3 to City Council. The final public hearing and City Council vote is September 13 at City Hall.

DOWNTOWN'S PLAN 2033 UPDATE

Our consultant's work continues on Downtown's next 10-year strategic action plan, Plan 2033. Seven subcommittees and scores of volunteers and community participants are helping shape their respective plan elements, including Business Development, Education, Hospitality, Housing, Retail Arts and Entertainment, Transportation, and Urban Design.



NEW ZONING DESIGNATION TO COMPLEMENT 'H' CENTRAL BUSINESS ZONING


Over the past decade, the character zones of the city's Downtown Urban Design District have seen an increased number of multifamily developments built. These developments resulted in numerous "planned developments" based on the "H" Central Business District zoning. A new "HP" Central Business District Peripheral zoning classification has been proposed.

The objective of this new district is multifold and will:

- · Encourage higher intensity residential and commercial uses in the Downtown area
- Assist in increasing the density of residential development Downtown
- Complement the "H" Central Business District and the Downtown Urban Design District
- Help meet the City's Comprehensive Plan, Downtown Strategic Action Plan: Plan 2023 and the Economic Development Strategic Plan goals
